BYLAW NO. 2/2005

A BYLAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS LILYDALE SCHOOL AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Hillsdale No. 440, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows: -

WHEREAS Sections 11 and 12 of *The Heritage Property Act* authorize the Council of a Municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings, features and structures thereon, to be of heritage value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Hillsdale No. 440 has determined that the property known as:

Lilydale School

and located at:

Six and one-half miles east of Neilburg, six miles north on Waseca Grid and four miles east is a site of architectural, historical, cultural, environmental, archaeological, palaeontological, aesthetic and/or scientific value; and,

WHEREAS not less than thirty (30) days prior to consideration of this bylaw, the Council of the Municipality has:

- a. served a Notice of Intention on the Registrar of Heritage Property and all owners of property included in the proposed bylaw:
- b. published a Notice of Intention in at least one issue of a newspaper in general circulation in the municipality
- registered an interest in the Land Titles Registry against all titles for the parcels of land included in the proposed bylaw; and

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Council of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Hillsdale No. 440 enacts as follows:

There is designated as Municipal Heritage Property the real property legally described as:

Blk/Par A Plan No 101643780 Extension 36

The reasons for the designation are as follows:

 To preserve and restore the Lilydale School as a historical site.
