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### Schedule 'C' Public Works Report

April was an okay month for snow melting, few roads needed some TLC and culvert opening. Graders are starting to work on roads.

2022 Road Construction - 'Floyd's Road'

- Met with K&D Prime Time Drilling for signatures
- Plan to begin construction in July
- Environmental has begun
- SaskPower will mend adjusting lines at no charge
- SaskTel will be doing work where we pay half of \$16,423 (estimated cost)

Ruberry Construction is not going forward, do we want to purchase ROW?

Baldwinton Grid Test Hole quotation for stability

- Barricades continue to be moved when replaced by our staff

Spraying Chemical, 20 bottles of Weathermax Round Up was purchased from Co-op Agro

Equipment - Grader Blades and mower blades purchased

SaskPower Pole Fix, covered under insurance

SaskPower had 2 Power Poles fall down effecting NW 13 & SW 24-44-24-3 due to saturation in a slough, 2 ratepayers were put on generators until fixed

Gravel Map completed at this point and delivered to McIntosh Construction May 6, 2022

- Reclaimer is not being utilized this season as only two roads will benefit
- Plan it to use it in the 2023 season
- Ecology pit road will have rocks dug and shoulders pulled improve road edges

#### **Dust Control for 2023**

- Foreman recommends to offer DL 10 dust control every 2 years
- Years in between it would be worked and relayed, as these areas are not drying out if 'sealed' each year

#### Paradox Area Shoulder

- Coconut matting, fines and grass seed will be used to stop future erosion
- Channel clearing may be looked at in area to improve drainage

Pest Control - Robert Knoll has passed course, will begin once license is issued

HHWRU - Justin is working Saturday May 7, 2022 for the RM.

#### Fire Departments

- Took part in a webinar regarding Minimum Standards Guidelines, for Saskatchewan Fire Service

## Schedule 'D' Division Boundary Review Policy

#### 201-7 Division Boundary Review

## **Purpose**

The purpose of this policy is to set out the manner in which Council will review the division boundaries. The Act requires that each division of the rural municipality have, as nearly as reasonably practical, the same population or number of voters.

#### Background

Changes to The Municipalities Act require that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Hillsdale No. 440 to review the division boundaries within 2 years of coming into force.

#### **Current Divisions**

1. Division 1 – All that portion described as Township 43 Range 23; Township 44; Range 23; Hamlet of Baldwinton and the Hutterian Brethren Church of Hillsvale Colony.

Population - 200

Voters - 173

IR - 1 1/4 sec

2. Division 2 - All that portion described as Township 43 Range 24 and Township 44 Range 24.

Population - 23

Voters – 53

Crown - 18 sec

IR - 7 34 sec

3. Division 3 - All that portion described as Township 43 Range 25; Section 1, 2, 12, 13, 24, 25, 31 Township 43 Range 26; Sections 1 through 18 inclusive Township 44 Range 25 and Section 1,12 Township 44 Range 26.

Population – 68

Voters - 90

Crown - 1 sec

4. Division 4 - All that portion described as Township 45 Range 23; Township 46 Range 23 and Hamlet of Carruthers.

Population – 40

Voters – 55

Crown - 23 34 sec IR - 2 sec

5. Division 5 - All that portion described as Township 45 Range 24 and Township 46 Range 24.

Population – 76

Voters - 121

Crown - 4 1/2 sec

6. Division 6 - All that portion described as Section 19 through 36 Township 44 Range 25 and Township 45 Range 25 excluding the Village of Neilburg.

Population - 60

Voters - 100

Crown - 5 34 sec

A review of division boundaries was undertaken in 2021. The eligible voter differences show that Division 2 and 4 have approximately 50 voters and the other divisions are all over 100. It is believed that those differences in population are historically consistent as those divisions have very few roads and large pasture areas. Council has decided to leave the division boundaries the same.

#### **Procedure**

- 1. In order for a division review to be triggered, a valid petition of the voters must be received by Council or a resolution of Council.
- 2. Council will establish a committee of 3 to undertake the review, the committee will consist of one member of council, one administrative personnel and one eligible voter, operating procedures and remuneration will follow applicable bylaws and policies.
  - a. The committee will have 3 months after their appointment to bring recommendations to council at a regular meeting.

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- b. Additional factors that can be used to determine fairness and equity in the division boundaries include assessment including hamlets and industrial assessment; road classification with weighting given to the higher class of road.
- c. The committee may recommend a Special Service Area, which may be assigned different tax rates and service levels.
- 3. Public notice shall be given that Council has received the recommendations of the committee. The report from the Division Review Committee will be available for public inspection on the website and in the municipal office for a period no less than 30 calendar days.

After the inspection period, Council may make resolution to apply to the ministry to alter boundaries.
